## Sabrina Licata becomes Miss Condor 2012

24 Miss Germany candidates turn the aircraft into a catwalk

Kelsterbach/Fuerteventura, January 27, 2012 – Right on time at 12:10 this afternoon, what was arguably the most beautiful flight ever, took off and headed south. Condor flight DE4474 from Frankfurt to Fuerteventura was not just taking people on vacation, it was also carrying 23 Miss Germany 2012 contestants to their beauty camp. Sabrina Licata, Miss Baden-Württemberg, won though against all the other candidates when the central aisle of the aircraft became a catwalk. The 265 passengers on board filled in their voting slips and elected her Miss Condor 2012.

All those taking part have a chance of becoming the new Miss Germany. Preparations get underway this year at a beauty camp in the Aldiana Hotel on Fuerteventura, where the Beauty Queens will have seven days of photoshootings and workshops. Their coaches, Monica Ivancan, model and catwalk coach, Ross Antony, red carpet, Paul Reeves, singing coach, Ines Kuba, deportment and etiquette, and Dr. Maik Irmisch, health and nutrition, are flying with them to Fuerteventura.

The grand final to elect Miss Germany 2012 takes place on February 11, 2012 at the Europa Park, in the southern German town of Rust. "We are keeping our fingers crossed for our Miss Condor Sabrina Licata", says Klenovsky. "Hopefully, she will not just be a winner above the clouds, but will also win through against the other contenders to become Miss Germany when she has solid ground beneath her feet."
