Condor stays on track for growth in winter 2012/13

Leisure carrier offers new destinations and additional flights from Germany and Austria

Kelsterbach, January 19, 2012 – Condor is extending its global route network and in the coming 2012/13 winter season, will be flying from Frankfurt to Rio de Janeiro in Brazil, Yangon (Rangoon) in Myanmar and Siem Reap (Angkor) in Cambodia. The flight plan at Vienna airport will now also include longhaul flights to Varadero in Cuba, in addition to the existing Caribbean destination of Punta Cana in the Dominican Republic. The leisure carrier's plans also include integrating two new Boeing 767-300 longhaul aircraft into their fleet by the end of the year.

The number of weekly flights to Cancun in Mexico, Santo Domingo and Punta Cana in the Dominican Republic and to Panama City in Panama, will each increase by one extra service. In the coming winter season, there will also be non-stop flights to both Montego Bay in Jamaica and Holguin in Cuba.

Condor still on track for growth

"We are proud that our fleet is continuing to grow and that we are able to include additional destinations in our winter 2012/13 flight plan", says Achim Lameyer, Sales Vice President of Condor. "Condor will be the first European airline to fly to the South-East Asian destinations of Yangon and Siem Reap. This makes us a more attractive leisure carrier, offering a vast range of different destinations, and will open up new markets for us."

Condor's Friday flights to Siem Reap in Cambodia will start on November 2, 2012. The city is an ideal starting point for travelers wishing to discover the variety that Cambodia has to offer. The world-famous Angkor Wat archeological site and other historical temple complexes can be found in the immediate vicinity of Siem Reap. The spectacular Mekong waterfalls in the east of the country are just as impressive as Tonle Sap, one of the largest lakes in the world, with its floating village. Or take up the invitation to relax on the glorious sandy beaches at Sihanoukville.

Tuesday flights to another South-East Asian Condor destination, Yangon (Rangun) in Myanmar, will also be part of the winter 2012/13 flight plan. Burma has many previously undiscovered treasures for tourists to explore in the country's largest city, with its unique palace complexes such as the golden Shwedagon Pagoda or the World Peace Pagoda, as well as in the old royal city of Mandalay. Yangon's food, textile and pharmaceutical industries also make it an industrial center, and it is the country's principle seaport.

The new Condor flight to Rio de Janeiro in Brazil will carry vacationers non-stop to the Sugar Loaf and Copacabana, on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. The city is primarily famous for its multicolored samba school parades at carnival time in Rio. As well as unique countryside, a tropical climate and wonderful beaches, Rio de Janeiro is also home to one of the Seven Wonders of the World, the 38-meter high statue of Christ the Redeemer. Historical and modern are united in the second-largest city in Brazil, a pattern that is further reinforced by its impressive architecture. The former imperial palace, numerals cathedrals, skyscrapers and the Museum of Contemporary Art give atmospheric Rio de Janeiro its rather special flair.
